# About Youth Ballet of Saskatchewan 40 years of excellence in dance



Youth Ballet of Saskatchewan, led by Artistic Director Michelle McMillan, is a non-profit dance organization. Our pre-professional Company fosters young artists to develop their unique voice through professional training, public performance, and contribution to the choreographic process.

In 1983, the Youth Ballet of Saskatchewan was created out of a dream of Vera and Gennadij Adrianow. They aspired to bring classical ballet, modern, and folk dance to the people of Saskatchewan while allowing the youth to discover these art forms both on and off the stage. The performing Company was re-established by former Artistic Director, Connie Moker-Wernikowski in 2001. Under Connie's direction, the Company's reputation for excellence and innovative works gained recognition among some of Canada's leading dance artists.

From its inception, high standards were set which led to exceptional and noteworthy invitations to Expo 86 in Vancouver; Expo 88 in Brisbane, Australia; Aberdeen International Youth Festival in Aberdeen, Scotland in 2013; and upcoming in Slovenia this coming July 2024 at the daCi (dance and the Child international) conference. Youth Ballet of Saskatchewan's Company has been honoured to represent Saskatchewan and Canada at these prestigious events.

Our 2023-2024 Company consists of 21 dancers between the ages of 13 to 18. The Company continues to share their love of dance and creativity by collaborating with different organizations and events such as the SHEA Awards, the Regina Symphony Orchestra Chamber Players, South Saskatchewan Youth Orchestra, the Halcyon Choir, India Canada Dinner, Saskatchewan's Telemiracle 40 and 42, and On Cue Performance Hub.

As well as its performances for the general public, the Company also prepares special school performances that combine the artistry of dance with education material relating to the Saskatchewan Ministry of Education's Arts curriculum.

# Choreographer Biographies

#### Glen Curtis - Regina, SK



Glen Curtis was born in Saskatoon and took his first Ballet Classes at the University School of Ballet under the direction of Sonja Barton. After attending the National Ballet School in Toronto, Mr. Curtis had a long and successful career in Germany, first as a dancer and then as a teacher.

Mr. Curtis was fortunate enough to have had the opportunity to work with many different choreographers and in a wide spectrum of various styles of dance. This has led him to a great appreciation of dance in all its forms and a firm belief in the importance of a strong Classical Ballet foundation.

#### Caitlin Coflin - Regina, SK



Caitlin Coflin has been involved with Youth Ballet of Saskatchewan since 1994 and became an instructor in 2010 after receiving a BA Honours in Dance from the University of Winnipeg in affiliation with School of Contemporary Dancers. Since returning to Regina, Caitlin has

worked as a professional dancer with Robin Poitras' company Rouge-Gorge and with Connie Moker Wernikowski, and has been given many opportunities to present her own work through New Dance Horizons. Most recently, she has become a Certified Movement Analyst and Somatic Practitioner (CMA-SP). Caitlin blends modern dance technique and somatic practices to help dancers find the duality between function and expression in their dance training.

#### Kennedy Dale-Johnson - Toronto, ON



Kennedy Dale-Johnson is a Toronto based dance teacher and choreographer. Originally from Regina, Saskatchewan, she danced at the Youth Ballet of Saskatchewan, taught on faculty and was part of the Youth Ballet Company. Kennedy is a graduate of Canada's National Ballet

School's (NBS) Teacher Training (Dip) Program, holds registered teaching status with the Royal Academy of Dance and has her Associate with the ISTD (National Branch). She has continued to pursue education with Mark Morris Dance Company (Dance for PD), Baycrest Hospital (Dancers not Dementia), Bob Rumball Centre for the Deaf, and more.

As Assistant Director for the Contemporary School of Dance Youth Company from 2018 to 2021, Kennedy's choreography has been seen in collaboration with the Kitchener-Waterloo Symphony, Kitchener-Waterloo Chamber Orchestra, and Fuse Arts (previously Vera Causa Opera Company). Currently, Kennedy teaches ballet at Pegasus Studios and works within the Community Dance initiatives at Canada's National Ballet School. This includes offering thousands of Ontario and Canada-wide school students' curriculum-based dance workshops both online and in person, teaching older adults including Dementia and Parkinson's specific classes, and teaching in the NBS Kids- Adaptive Dance program which was created in collaboration with Holland Bloorview Kids Rehabilitation Hospital.

#### **Barbara Diaz**



Barbara was born in Regina, Sk. and started taking ballet at an early age. In learning dance, she quickly realized that she wanted to expand her knowledge and thus enrolled at the Boston Conservatory. While there she studied ballet under Samuel Kurkjian, Ann Marie Sarazin,

Donna Silva, and Mel Tomlinson. She also studied Modern dance with Jennifer Scanlon, Jessica Sayre, Tommy Neblitt, Yasuko and Emiko Tokunaga and was introduced to Flamenco.

Upon graduating cum laude from the Conservatory, Barbara sought to further her knowledge of Flamenco which took her to Granada, Spain. There, she studied with the school of Carmen de las Cuevas. In 2001 she travelled to Jerez de la Frontera where she immersed herself in the culture and was accepted within the Flamenco community. She credits the amazing teachings of Ana Maria Lopez and Juan Para for what she has been able to create. In 2005 she recognized a need and want of Flamenco dance in Regina, Sk. so she established Flamenco Diaz. For 7 years she encouraged many to explore their potential as dancers and artists. During that time, she was also on the faculty of the Youth Ballet of Saskatchewan, teaching ballet and Flamenco.

Currently, Barbara lives in Ottawa, Ontario where she runs Flamenco Diaz Ottawa as well as keeps busy with an active Alexander Technique practice.

#### Rosa Mirijello Haynes - Regina, SK



Rosa Mirijello-Haynes was mentored in North Indian classical Kathak by master dancer, Joanna de Souza of Toronto and participated in several intensive Kathak retreats with Joanna's guru, Pandit Chitresh Das of California. She studied music at the University of Toronto where she

also began her studies in Kathak dance. After moving to Regina, her teaching and performing led to several workshops throughout the province including DACI, RAMED, and performing at several festivals including Fringe Dance (Toronto), International Day of Dance, NDH's Stream of Dance, and Secret Garden Tours. Presently, Rosa is the Arts Ed. Specialist at École Elsie Mironuck Community School where she creates unique dance and music opportunities for the students. She is thrilled to return to YBCS yearly to share her love of Kathak dance with the dancers.

#### Michelle McMillan - Regina, SK



Dance has always been Michelle's passion. She trained near her hometown in Southern California in numerous dance forms with a primary focus on the Vaganova style of classical ballet. After dancing in a few regional ballet companies in California and dealing with injury,

Michelle shifted her focus to a career utilizing her studies in Jazz, Tap, Modern, and Vocal Music. She spent the next 10 years dancing throughout the United States and Europe. Some of her favourite credits include: 5 years as one of the famous Radio City Rockettes; Equity productions of The Will Rogers' Follies, Annie Get Your Gun; fire-eater with Penn & Teller in Las Vegas; and an adage specialty act that combined pas de deux and acrobatics. Michelle's favourite role was her last, for it was where she met her husband.

Michelle has been an instructor at the Youth Ballet since 2008, and as its Artistic Director since 2013. Michelle also sits on the Board of Directors for Dance Saskatchewan Inc. She continuously looks forward to broadening her knowledge, helping others find the joy in dance, and supporting our youth to follow their dreams. She thanks her husband and 2 young boys for their constant love and support.

#### Nathan Powell - Boise, ID USA



Nathan Powell is a dancer, teacher and choreographer based in Boise Idaho. He is the Co-Artistic Director of Idaho Dance Theatre. Originally from Regina, he received his professional training at Canada's Royal Winnipeg Ballet School and has danced for numerous dance

companies such as Festival Ballet Providence, Ballet San Antonio and Ballet Idaho. He has choreographed numerous works for Ballet Idaho, Idaho Dance Theatre, and Ballet Montana. His work "What you Wanted for Me" was selected from a pool of over 200 applicants to be a part of the Dance Gallery Festival at Sam Houston State University in Hunstville, TX in October 2017. He has also choreographed works for Black Hills Dance Theatre, Opera Idaho, Anchorage Ballet, Northern Plains Dance, and the Boise Dance Co-op. He is the winner of the "Esther Simplot Award for Choreographic Excellence" for his work "Suite." He is also an avid teacher of dance and teaches a number of adult ballet classes regularly. Nathan has taught as a guest instructor for Youth Ballet of Saskatchewan, North Ballet Academy (MN), Sun Valley Ballet, and Anchorage Ballet.

#### Kathryn Ricketts - Regina, SK



Kathryn's choreographic approach is based on years of company work as a dancer and later as a choreographer under the term of 'devised choreography'. This entails generating material from the dancers through thematic prompts and then collectively shaping and crafting

it into a cohesive dance. This approach enables the dancers to exercise their own artistic voices and at the same time build their skills and sensibility to think of themselves as both dancers and dance makers.

#### Paula Skotnitsky – Regina, SK



Paula trained in Yorkton, Red Leaf, British Columbia with Victoria Arts Collaborative, in Regina with Youth Ballet of Saskatchewan, and in numerous workshops over the years. She has a degree in Arts Education and has completed a certificate in Special Education from the Universi-

ty of Regina. Paula has presented her own solo work at both the Stream of Dance Festival and the W.I.P Series (Saskatoon). As well as teaching dance at Youth Ballet of Saskatchewan, she has also choreographed for the Youth Ballet Company for several seasons. Paula works full-time for Regina Catholic Schools as an Arts Education teacher.

#### Yevhenii Tretiak - Regina, SK



Yevhenii Tretiak is a dance artist, teacher, and choreographer, new to Regina from Ukraine. He has been an organizer of dance events and concerts, and a competition judge, as well.

Yevhenii's dance journey began more than 20 years ago with self-education. He trained in many dance styles from break dance to classical dance. From the time he was in high school, he knew that he would become a dance teacher.

Yevhenii realized that he needed to pursue a professional education in order to fulfill his dreams. His studies lasted almost 10 years, from College to University, and earned him a Master's Degree in Dance Education.

In parallel with his studies, he started teaching in several dance studios and children's sports schools in Poltava and the surrounding region. By the time he completed his degree, he had created his own dance school.

Since 2022, Yevhenii has been a teacher at the Martin School of Dance and Baton teaching children ballet technique, modern and contemporary dance.
